County Football

For the first time ever, two Ledbury teams were entered into this year's Herefordshire County Football Tournament to compete against 43 other schools. Both teams set off full of excitement, nerves and determination to succeed. To start, each team was in a 'Pool' where 4 games had to be played. Depending on the outcome of the games, they would then proceed into either the Cup, Plate, Shield or Bowl.

Ledbury A won 3 out of 4 games (drawing one) which put them into the Cup for the afternoon. Ledbury B (despite NEVER having played together) worked brilliantly to draw 2 and lose 2 morning games which qualified them for the Shield. After many matches, battles and more penalties than any of us have ever seen, Ledbury B were sadly knocked out at the final 16 Quarter Finals but Ledbury A made it all the way to the final match!! After a tense 10 minutes, they were sadly defeated 1-0 in the closing stages of the game and came home with silver medals.

All children played their hearts out and represented Ledbury Primary School perfectly. They did themselves and all of us proud. A huge thank you to Steve Phillips for coaching Ledbury A and for Mrs Potter managing Ledbury B.

HISTORY WORKSHOPS

Y5 and Y6 History workshops

We know that bringing History to life through drama can make the content accessible and helps the knowledge to stick. Y5 and 6 loved their experiences, as relayed here by Jack from Y6.



Year 5 and 6 have been treated with a workshop visit by a member of West End in schools.

They have been shown about their main history topic, in which year 5 have done the excellent Ancient Egyptians, and the year 6 did stone age. The sessions included a range of miming, where a certain group of 3 performed their act. These being hunting, gathering, trading and so much more. They also did imaginary games, like jumping over an imaginary ball.

The main focus of the stone age shows how the stone age civilians worshipped the sun, creating Stonehenge, which if you look at it in a sunrise, the sun's light shines through the gap of the stone. The year 5 did about pharaohs and ships.

The visitor, Jimmy, helped by instructing the children, ranging from 9-11 years of age. They used a time machine (it was imaginary because time machines don't exist currently), which sent them back 30,000 years in time (the year 6's) and about 5000 years (the year 5's). Jimmy went through each of the groups, seeing how they act. They linked their knowledge with imagination, and created a brilliant hour of history.

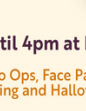
