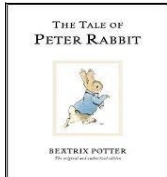


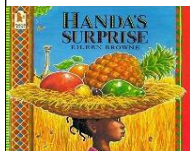

by Beatrix Potter

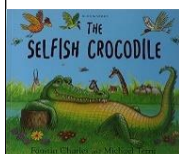
This tells the story of a very mischievous rabbit and the trouble he encounters in Mr McGregor's vegetable garden.

by Eileen Brown

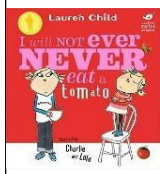

by Faustin Charles & Mike Terry

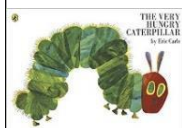

by Lauren Child

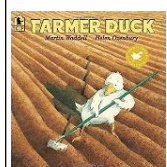

A very hungry caterpillar emerges from an egg & spends an entire week feasting on all kinds of foods.

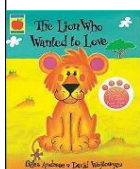


Farmer Duck

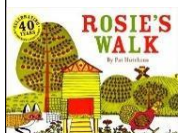
simple but heroic plan.

by Giles Andreae

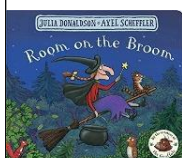

by Pat Hutchins

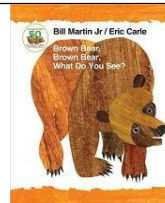

by Julia Donaldson

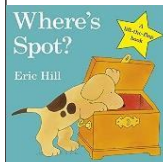

by Bill Martin Jr

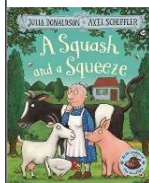
Exuberantly coloured artwork & favourite animals make this rhythmic story the perfect introduction to looking & learning about colours.

by Eric Hill

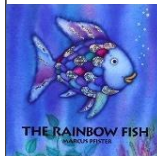
In Spot's first adventure, children can join in the search for the mischievous puppy by lifting the flaps on every page to see where he is hiding.

by Julia Donaldson & Axel Scheffler

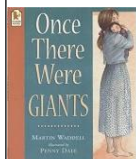
A little old lady lives all by herself in her house but she's not happy - it's just too small, even for one. Whatever can she do?

by Marcus Pfister

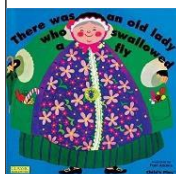

by Martin Waddell

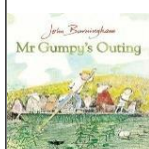

by Pam Adams

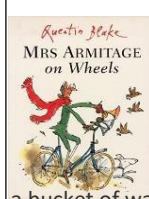
A favourite nursery rhyme comes to life in this hilarious picture book. Children will love singing along as the old lady continues to bite off more than she can chew.

by John Burningham

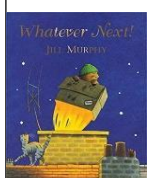
Mr. Gumpy's cow becomes a miniature ark when he takes two children & one each of various domestic animals for a ride

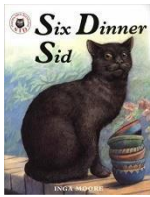


Whatever Next

The moon and back before bath time? Whatever next! Join Baby Bear as he finds a rocket, makes friends with an owl & has a picnic on the moon!

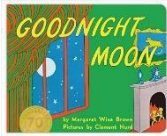

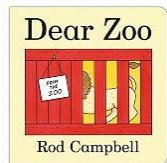


Goodnight Moon

In a great green room, a little bunny is tucked up snugly & safely in bed and is getting ready to say goodnight to all the familiar things in

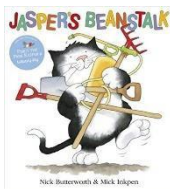
his room, one by one.

by Rodd Campbell

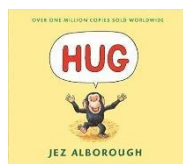
Young children will love lifting the flaps to discover the animals the zoo has sent - a monkey, a lion and even an elephant! But will they ever manage to send the perfect pet?

squeeze. But poor Bobo is alone. Will he ever find the hug he needs?

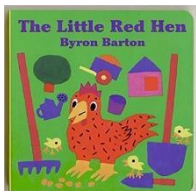


Come on Daisy

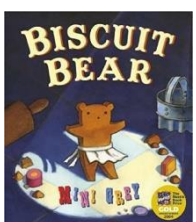

A little red hen grows grain, threshes wheat, bakes bread, & feeds her chicks— all by herself, without any help from her lazy friends.

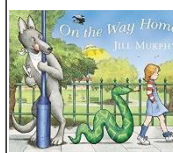


Biscuit Bear

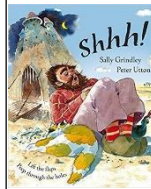
does just that. In fact, he makes a whole circus of friends and the fun begins . . .

by Jill Murphy

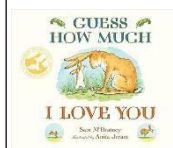

Shhhh! You are about to enter a giant's castle. Can you get through the book without waking up the enormous scary giant? What will you do if he wakes up?

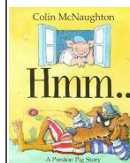


Guess How Much I Love You

Sometimes, when you love someone very, very much, you want to find a way of describing how much you treasure them. But,

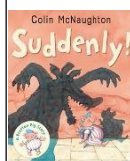
as Little Nutbrown Hare and Big Nutbrown Hare discover, love is not always an easy thing to measure.

by Colin McNaughton

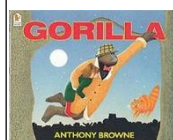

by Colin McNaughton

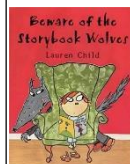

by Lauren Child

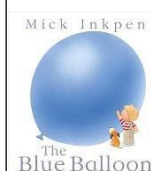
