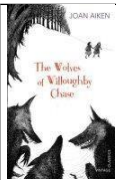


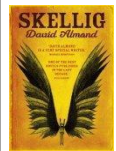


Recommended Reads For Year 6

Exploring a ramshackle garage with his new-found friend, Mina, Michael discovers a strange, magical creature



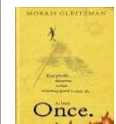
Carrie's War by Nina Bawden

During WW2, Carrie & her younger brother Nick are evacuated to Wales & billeted with the fierce old Mr Evans and his mousy sister, Louise.



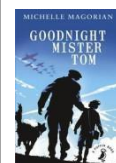
Artemis Fowl by Eoin Colfer

Morris Gleitzman brings heart & humour to the difficult subject of the Holocaust in this ground-breaking children's book.



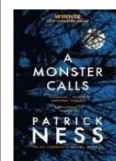
Goodnight Mister Tom by Michelle Magorian

Willie Beech, a lonely & deprived child, is evacuated to a tiny English village just before the Second World War, & finds himself living with reclusive widower Thomas Oakley.



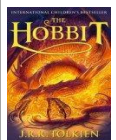
Private Peaceful by Michael Morpurgo

Connor's mum has cancer & life is changing. There is the nightmare, then there is school, where people avoid him, or persecute him. And then there is the immense, mythic Monster!



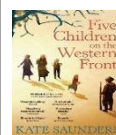
The Hobbit by J.R.R. Tolkien

This well-loved fantasy story has delighted readers ever since its first publication in 1937.



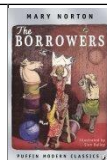
Cogheart by Peter Bunzl

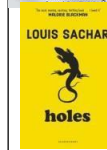
Five Children & The Western Front by Kate Saunders

First published in the 1930s, this classic story of three very different girls who work hard to master their talents has captivated children's imaginations for decades



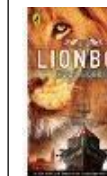
Eren by Simon P. Clark

The Railway Children by E. Nesbit

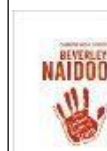
A classic story of adventure and loss. Three children & their mother leave London to live in the country. Will they discover the mystery of the disappearance of their father?

them?



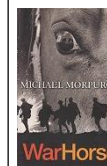
The Other Side of The Truth by Beverley Naidoo

Sade & her brother Fami are "illegals". They have fled from Nigeria where their father has been persecuted only to find London harsh and unforgiving land.



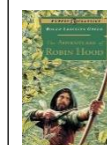
The Silver Sword by Ian Serraillier

War Horse by Michael Morpurgo

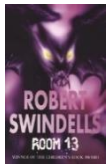
Set in WW1, the story follows Joey's extraordinary journey as he moves through the war, changing and inspiring the lives of all those he meets.



The Adventures of Robin Hood by Roger Lancelyn Green

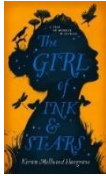
The classic tale of the mischievous Master of Sherwood Forest, who bedevils the implacable Sheriff of Nottingham during the reign of Richard the Lionhearted.

The Girl of Ink & Stars by Kiran

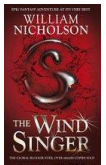
Millwood-Hargrave

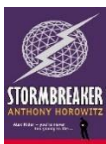
Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children by Ransom Riggs

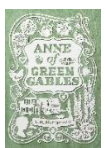
Sabriel by Garth Nix

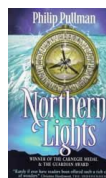
The Dark Is Rising by Susan Cooper

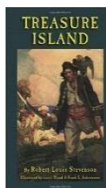
Eagle of the Ninth by Rosemary Sutcliff
